one syllable	Add -er fast -> faster slow -> slower When an adjective ends in one vowel + one consonant, we double the consonant: big -> bigger hot -> hotter
two-syllable words ending in consonant + -y	-y -> -ier heavy -> heavier early -> earlier
two or more syllables	Use more ... dangerous -> more dangerous intelligent -> more intelligent
irregular	good -> better bad -> worse far -> further
